WHAT HAVE THE CHILDREN BEEN LEARNING?

Primary 1	We are learning about electricity. We are learning how to work out missing numbers.
Primary 2	We are learning to find the total of a group of coins. We are learning about mythical creatures. We are learning ball skills.
Primary 3	We are learning to add 2 digit numbers vertically and with carrying. We are learning to write stories. We are learning to spell 'se' words.
Primary 7a	We are learning about different shading techniques. We are learning how to create a newspaper article. We are learning how to multiply (long & short multiplication).

SCHOOL MEALS AND CLOTHING GRANTS

Primary 1-3 pupils are entitled to free a meal daily. Children in P4, 5, 6 and 7 whose parents are in receipt of one of the following benefits, are also entitled to a free midday meal:

- Income Support
- Income based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Child Tax Credit, but not Working Tax Credit, and where income is less than £15,860 (as assessed by the Inland Revenue)
- An asylum seeker receiving support under Part V1 of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Any income related element of Employment and Support Allowance
- Parent or carer is in receipt of Working Tax Credit with an income below the threshold
- for receipt of maximum Working Tax Credit (currently income below £6,420)

Parents of children receiving one or more of the above benefits will usually* be entitled to monetary grants for footwear and clothing for their children.

Information and application forms for free school meals for pupils in Primaries 4 -7 and clothing grants for those in Primaries 1 - 7 may be obtained from the school and Education Services, Wallace Place, Greenock, PA15 1 JB. In addition these pupils are entitled to free milk.

*Approval of any requests for such grants made by parents in different circumstances is at the discretion of the Corporate Director of Education and Communities.
